This is our natural spiritual condition.

We are separated from God, our Father.

Ephesians 2:1-3

And you He made alive, who were dead in trespasses and sins, in which you once walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air,

the spirit who now works in the sons of disobedience, among whom also we all once conducted ourselves in the lusts of our flesh, ...

Ephesians 2:1-3

fulfilling the desires of the flesh and of the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, just as the others.

God has a solution:

Grace

Ephesians 2:4-5

God, who is rich in mercy, because of His great love..., even when we were dead in trespasses, made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved)

Romans 5:10

For if when we were enemies we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son, much more, having been reconciled, we shall be saved by His life.

Our main problem:

Death, not Debt

1 Corinthians 6:9-10

Do you not know that the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God?

Do not be deceived. ...

1 Corinthians 6:9-10

Neither fornicators, idolaters, adulterers, homosexuals, sodomites, thieves, covetous, drunkards, revilers, nor extortioners will inherit the kingdom of God.

1 Corinthians 6:11

And such were some of you. But you were washed, but you were sanctified, but you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus and by the Spirit of our God.

Past tense:
"Such were some of you..."

Washed = cleansed Sanctified = purified, separated Justified = ??????

Justify dikaioō

- 1) to make one to be just
- 2) to prove one to be just
- 3) to declare one to be just

Sin <u>no</u> more, not <u>some</u> more.

John 5:14 – Stop sinning.

John 8:11 – Leave your life of sin.

Joint effort

Son's part: Luke 15:20
He got up and went
to his father.
He left the pigs behind.

Joint effort

Father's part: Luke 15:22

Brought out the best robe and put it on his son.

He replaced his son's filthy rags.

Zechariah 3:3-4

Now Joshua was clothed with filthy garments, and was standing before the Angel. Then He answered and spoke to those who stood before Him, saying, ...

Zechariah 3:3-4

"Take away the filthy garments from him." And to him He said, "See, I have removed your iniquity from you, and I will clothe you with rich robes."

Joint effort

Result: Luke 15:24
Dead son is alive again.
Lost son is found.

How did the son get to this point?

Luke 15:17-18

He came to his senses.

He chose to return to his father.

He wanted to separate from the world and join his father again.

We must want to separate from sin and join the Father.

Some do not like the idea of separating from sin.



How do we fight this battle?

We must give ourselves to God. We must give up anything that separates us from God.

What might separate us from God?

Evil actions
Evil words
Evil thoughts and feelings
Money

What might separate us from God?

Reputation and honor
Freedom from responsibility
Pride
Selfishness

We cannot be half the Lord's and half the world's.

Did you give up ALL old boyfriends/girlfriends?

We must choose:

Do we want God?
Or
Do we want sin?

Luke 14:33

So likewise, whoever of you does not forsake all that he has cannot be My disciple.

What are we giving up?

A sinful, corrupted heart that Jesus will wash, sanctify, and justify.

God wants only the best for us.

Forsake only that which would bring suffering.

Perform only that which will lead to happiness.

Sin always leads to suffering and destruction.

True joy is found only in following Christ's instruction and example.

God wants to heal us.

But we must submit completely to Him.

How do I surrender myself to God?

Everything depends on the right action of the will.

You cannot change your heart.
Some things are beyond
your control.

You can choose to serve God.

Give God full control.

Your affections will be centered upon Him. Your thoughts will be in harmony with Him.

Many will be lost while hoping and desiring to be Christians.

They do not now choose to be Christians.
